Curriculum course descriptions

RES503 Research and Evaluation

3-hour

This course focused on increasing the credibility of research and evaluation Education and Psychology as it integrating diversity with quantitative, qualitative, and Mixed Methods. This course further incorporates the viewpoints of various research paradigms into its descriptions of these methods by providing specific advice on conducting research in culturally complex communities.

HEM513 Hermeneutics

3-hour

This course is a basic study introducing the student to the science of interpreting the Scriptures. Various phases and methods of understanding interpretation are examined and explored.

CED523 Apologetics

3-hou

This is a study of Christian Apologetics for the purpose of equipping the pastor, minister, or lay leader in the defense of the Truths of God. This study is in three parts: 1) deals with various tests for truth in order to lay a foundation for testing the "truths" of various world views, 2) applies the test for truth to those views, and 3) works within the theistic view to verify the deity of Jesus and the authority of the Bible.

CED533 Introducing Religious Education

3-hour

Successful religious education ministry is built on strong foundations. Yet religious education is often steeped in misunderstanding and misconception. Although grounded in biblical studies and theology, religious education seeks to integrate these areas with a variety of social sciences including education, sociology, and psychology. This course presents an outstanding guide to this integration that fills the need for an introductory course providing an overview and understanding of the broad range of subjects included in religious education.

CED543 Teaching for Result

3-hour

Teaching goals and Christian action comprise the basis for this study. It is designed for teacher training. Students who plan to explore the teaching ministry will benefit great results from recipients.

CED553 Teaching Cross-cultural and Diversity

3-hour

The course *Teaching Cross-Culturally* is a challenging consideration of what it means to be a religious educator in a culture other than your own, and include discussions about how to uncover cultural biases, how to address intelligence and learning styles, and teaching for biblical transformation. CED613 Creative Bible Teaching

3-hour

CED673 Theology for Christian Education

3-hour

This course is integration between theology and Christian education attempting to not only influence the church in general, but to holistically impact the church. This course introduces theology as a filter to sift through social sciences and allow the methodology to proceed from them. This course does not see education and theology as two.

Course: CED700 Thesis Research Project

Students are solely responsible to present the research project as required the first time to avoid any denial proposal and extra fee.
